### From the Vicarage Office

A few weeks ago, I was leading the Evening Prayer Telephone service – if you've never dialled in before, you should try it! The New Testament reading for that week was from Paul's letter to the Ephesians (4:25-5:2). The words at the end of the passage really struck a chord:

'Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children and live in love, as Christ loved us'

Have you ever thought about living your life in imitation of God? That is an interesting thought, isn't it? But what does it mean in reality?

We know that we are all created in the image of God. We all also have the ability to be creative, like God. We can imagine and create things – just look at the variety of things people have designed and built and the stories that have been written. So we can imitate God in that way but I don't think that was what Paul meant when he tells us to imitate God!

"Be imitators of God," Paul writes, "as beloved children." I think the key here to understanding what Paul means is in the words, "beloved children." We are all God's beloved children, and just like all children, we learn by imitating our parents -in this case, our heavenly father. And as we are God's beloved children, we should act like it.

Paul says earlier in the passage:

"Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tender hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you."

Imitating God begins with kindness, and with love and forgiveness. Jesus demonstrates his kindness and compassion in so many ways throughout his ministry.

Put away bitterness, Paul tells us, together with all malice, and be kind to one another. That means - be kind on social media. Be kind on the roads. Be kind in shops and restaurants. At church. At work, at home, with our families. Be kind to one another and to ourselves. Put away all our nasty thoughts. Be full of grace and forgive one another, endlessly.

It sounds easy to do, but it really isn't. Wouldn't the world be a better place if it was filled with kindness? As God's people, we should be leading the way on this and as we move into autumn, I am going to try to imitate my God more closely. A wave of kindness has to start somewhere – where better than Wensleydale?

#### **Keswick Ministries and the Keswick Convention**

'Keswick Ministries exists to inspire and equip Christians to love and live for Christ in His world.'



The Keswick Convention runs for three weeks each summer. The central theme this year was 'Resurrection' but each week had its own separate programme, and speakers for the Morning Bible Study, the Evening Meetings and the Seminars throughout the day. More than 12,000 people attended over the three-week period and in addition meetings were live streamed around the town to overflow venues as well as being available to watch live at home or at many locations around the world. You could watch on 'catch-up', to the Bible readings on Isaiah by David Gibson from week one, Studies from Ezekial by Andrew Sach from week two or Studies on the Psalms by Vaughan Roberts from week three. Alternatively, watch one of the evening meetings just to get a feel for the worship and teaching.

Next year will be its 150<sup>th</sup> year and it has always provided teaching from God's word free of charge. There is no need to book – you just turn up. (Though of course you will need to book accommodation in the town well in advance or just visit for a day). The work of Keswick Ministries and the cost of the Convention are covered totally by donations.

Since moving to its new site by the old Pencil Factory it has totally renovated the building to provide training rooms and conference facilities that are used during the convention weeks for seminar venues and the youth and children's programmes. Throughout the year, Keswick Ministries are now able to provide Bible Teaching and training events as well as being a resource for churches across the region and beyond.
