Pantomime Visit-Wednesday 11th December

All the children from **Reception to Year 6** will be visiting Richmond Georgian Theatre to see the pantomime "Treasure Island" during the morning. Nursery children will remain in school with Mrs. Race as the visit will be longer than their usual morning session. We will be leaving school at 8.50 promptly so could all the children please be in school for 8.35 (**not before)** to register and visit the toilet. The children will return to school to have their lunch in the canteen although this will be a little later. Please can all the children wear their school uniform for the visit and bring a small snack for the journey that will fit in their coat pockets.

Thank you to the PTFA for funding this for all the school to visit the pantomime.

Christingle

On Wednesday 18th December we will be going to the Church for our annual Christingle Service. This will be at 10.00 am in St Margaret's Church with Rev Dave and Mrs. Clark. We look forward to seeing parents and families at our special Christmas event.

<u>Nativity</u>

We have continued to work on our production with the stage up this week for the children. Nursery are enjoying singing their songs and the other children are busy learning their words. The nursery children will need to wear a Christmas jumper on the day of the performance, and we have Santa hats for them to wear. Some of the Y1/2 children have been asked for costumes although we have most in school. Please arrive at 1.45/5.45 for the performances to sign in, when the door will be opened. **Please can parents not video or photograph the performance as we have some children who cannot have their photos shared on social media.** We will try to photograph all the children and send you a photograph home as we do with other Class 1 events. Thank you for your support and help with this in safeguarding all our children.

School Uniform.

Our uniform comprises: Navy blue Hawes Primary School sweatshirt. Hawes School polo shirt in house colours. Navy or plain black trousers/shorts or skirts. Shorts should be trouser shorts – not sports shorts / cycling shorts. Shoes, not trainers, should be worn. In bad weather, boots or wellingtons may be worn to school but pupils will be expected to change into their shoes or pumps once inside.

In PE children must wear plain navy or black shorts or leggings/tracksuit bottoms and plain white t -shirts / polo shirts. They should have trainers or pumps to wear. As we now come to school in PE clothes for lessons and clubs rather than getting changed, can the children please wear appropriate clothing for the school day.

Holidays in Term time

Taking a pupil on leave during term time interrupts teaching and learning and can disrupt educational progress for all children. Please note that penalty notices will be issued to parents/carers for unauthorised absence during this academic school year.

The school will be closely monitoring all absences and patterns of absence to ensure our attendance figures return to our normal level of 97 to 98% - this may include requesting confirmation of appointments etc. We would be grateful for your support in ensuring your child attends school regularly in line with the government regulations.
