Message from Miss Caygill Head of School

Dear parents/carers,

We have had some amazing news this week. YCAT have been awarded the Gold National Wellbeing Award. Mrs. Metcalfe has been our lead working on this with other YCAT schools and we would like to thank her for the amazing contribution she makes every day to the well-being of children and staff across school. This is an overview of the work carried out to achieve the award:

Hawes Primary School looked at changing culture whilst working on the RAW project. This included lunchtime well-being walks where pupils engaged with different children from across the school years, listening and speaking more confidently and practicing some *learning techniques for self-help. Pupil* ambassadors were chosen from each year group which gave other children the opportunity to talk to an ambassador before an adult if preferred. The pupil well-being ambassadors composed a poem about pupil voice which was performed to a whole school assembly to demonstrate the importance of respect and tolerance for everyone.

As a whole school staff, we continue to work on the well-being of all children throughout their learning and wider school experiences. We are always available to talk to parents if you have any concerns around the children.
